


How Jesus Overcame Temptation

1. We See the **Subject** of the Temptation.


Luke 4:1–2¹ Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the desert, ² where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry.-- (NIV)

A. The Lust of the Flesh


Luke 4:3³ The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread."-- (NIV)
